In artist Di Mainstone's imagined world, Tower Bridge becomes abundant (full) with flowers. Fill your home with flora by making these beautiful origami flowers.

#### **Paper**

Don't worry if you don't have origami paper. Any paper will do – just cut it to size (15cm x 15cm works well).

Perhaps you have some magazines or newspapers that no-one wants anymore or small bits of wrapping paper? Or you can even colour in the paper yourself before folding.









If you don't have any coloured paper, you can print this out and cut the squares out to use.



# Origami

This origami flower is so simple and satisfying to make, and even stands up all on its own! Create a tulip display for your windowsill!



Stem



Fold and unfold diagonally to create crease



Fold top edge to centre




Repeat fold on the other side




Fold top edge to centre and repeat on other side




Turn and fold top edge in

Fold above centre, top to bottom



Turn and fold in half




#### Flower head

Turn over and there's your flower head!






Cut a small piece off the bottom of the flower






This one is a little trickier to make, but the results make it worth persisting with! Take your time, follow the instructions carefully, and ask for help or check the video if you need to.



Fold in half


Fold in half again






Open the end part and flatten







Turn over




Open the right end part and flatten




Fold up to meet in centre




Open the centre triangles and flatten




Fold



Turn over and repeat other side




Fold down 'peak' and pick up




Fold to make a crease and fold back




Fold and open

Open up one side of the standing triangle and push one side of this downwards. Repeat for other side Holding the base in one hand, gently twist the stem in the middle to the right, and a little flower forms!

Roll back the petals to make them look more natural
